FORT MCKAY FIRST NATION

FIRE RECOVERY IN FORT MCMURRAY AND WOOD BUFFALO

THE COMMUNITY OF FORT MCKAY IS LOCATED IN THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF WOOD BUFFALO (RMWB), 40 MINUTES NORTH OF FORT MCMURRAY.

Fort McKay assisted in the emergency response through deploying its Firefighter Department, sheltering evacuees and well as a number of its member owned businesses provided emergency response services such as camps, busing, water and medical.

Thankfully, Fort McKay's infrastructure and community was not damaged. However, many community members and staff who have homes in Fort McMurray have been displaced.

With cleanup and rebuilding plans underway, the Nation will also take a significant role in these efforts.

These efforts will be primarily conducted through the FMGOC and the three business partners it has assembled to collaborate on the fire recovery efforts.

This Consortium will first provide subcontracting opportunities to local independent business from Fort McKay. Second, subcontracting opportunities will be provided to other First Nations businesses including Seven Lakes Oilfield and Canada First Management Corporation.

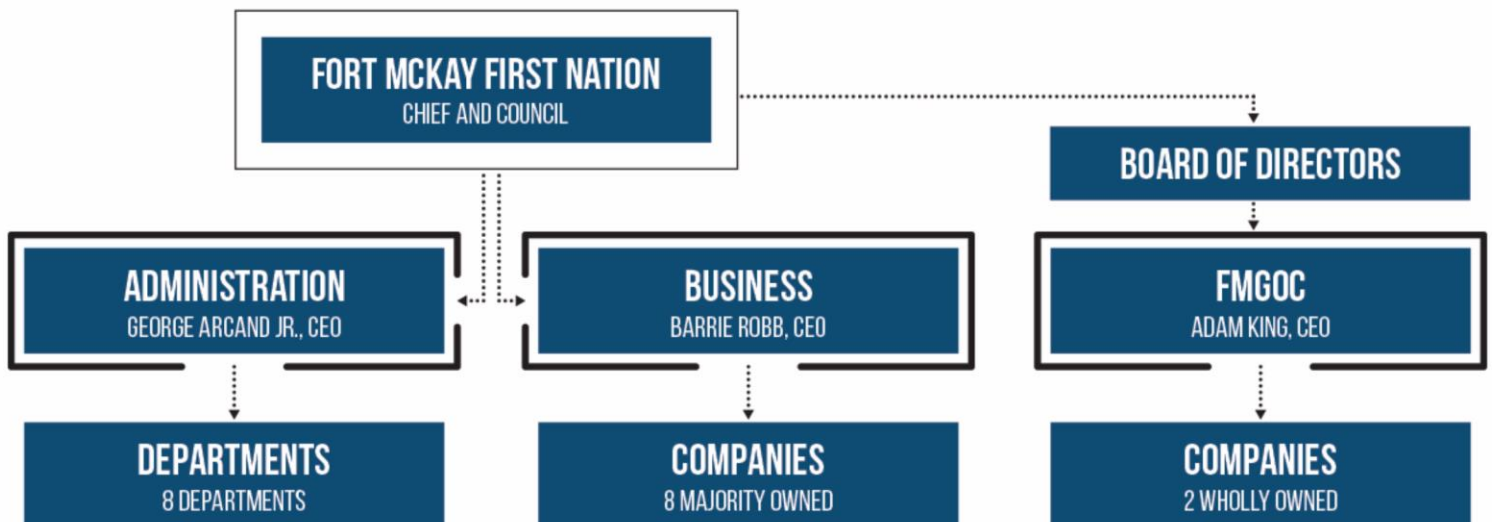


FORT MCKAY FIRST NATION ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

THE NATION FIRST ENTERED INTO BUSINESS IN 1986 WHEN IT ESTABLISHED THE FORT MCKAY GROUP OF COMPANIES.

FMFN is organized into three (3) units. The Administration unit is responsible for the provision of services and governance in the community. In addition, there are two (2) business groups.

One business group is a wholly owned holding company that has a portfolio of majority owned companies. The other is the Fort McKay Group of Companies (FMGOC), which is wholly owned and operated.

DISASTER RESPONSE AND RESTORATION

WE HAVE A LONG SERVICE HISTORY IN FORT MCMURRAY AND THE RMWB AND ARE UNIQUELY POSITIONED TO PROVIDE TURNKEY SERVICES FROM DEMOLITION TO RECONSTRUCTION TO GET OUR COMMUNITY UP AND RUNNING QUICKLY.

FIRST NATIONS DISASTER RECOVERY EXPERIENCE

WE HAVE ASSISTED THE SIKSIKA, BIGHORN, STONEY NAKODA AND EDEN VALLEY FIRST NATIONS WITH DISASTER RECOVERY PROJECTS.

From 2013-16, we served as the construction manager for the Province of Alberta's "First Nations Disaster Recovery Housing Program" associated with the Calgary and area floods. Our areas of responsibility included:

- Repairs to 1,183 homes located in the First Nation communities, consisting of roofing, foundations, site grading, washrooms and kitchens, basement restoration, mechanical systems, drywall, flooring and finishes
- Complete structural and cosmetic assessments of all damaged homes, including field work assessments, scope of work, budgets and logistics plans
- Development of project rebuild and remediation schedules
- Removal of hazardous materials, code upgrades and corrective maintenance
- Continuous emergency pump-outs for septic fields and septic replacements
- Relocated, set, tied in and restored 64 modular units from Slave Lake
- Renovations to 2 seniors lodges to accommodate additional temporary rooms
- Full documentation, photos and backup coordination for insurance providers
